Simonka House

Last year more than 278 guests were served at Simonka Place a shelter for women and children. Whether seeking immediate relief or long-term support, everyone has the same opportunity for life transformation. More than two thirds of the women that are cared for have suffered from domestic or sexual violence, which have long-lasting effects on its victims. Such abuse is often a root cause for homelessness, among many other factors including mental illness and unforeseen life events.

NLF Programs – The New Life Fellowship program is the arm of our Restorative Services. We holistically address substance abuse issues and other addictive behaviors.

Employment Services – Employment services are offered to women with children who are employable and do not struggle with addiction.

Supportive Services – Support Services are offered to women who do not struggle with addiction and are not currently employable. These women may be battling either nebtak health and/or physical disabilities, victims of domestic violence, senior citizens, or mothers.

Another way to help is by joining The June Simonka Giving Circle. The Giving Circle is a group of caring people dedicated to supporting our most culnearble sister through wolunteerism, financial support and learning more the complexities of homelessness for women and children. Giving Circle Members connect personally with our homeless sisters to restore dignity, empowering each woman to break free from homeless ness and thrive in her calling.

o The Vice-President shall preside at the meetings of the Executive Committee, the Congregation Council and the congregation in the absence of the President. The Vice-President shall also serve as convener of the Nominating Committee.

Council Secretary - (currently Chuck Palmquist)

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Congregation Council and of the congregation and shall have custody of the archives of the congregation. The Secretary shall create and maintain a master calendar of Council responsibilities and include these actions on the monthly Council agendas.

• Council Financial Secretary - (currently Laura Drager)

 The Financial Secretary shall be responsible for the receipt of funds, maintain records of all contributions and make regular reports to the Congregation Council and to the members as required by the Council.

• At large Council Member - (currently Wendy Smith)

- The Congregation Council shall have general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life, to the end that everything be done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - a. To lead this congregation in stating its mission, to do long-range planning, to set goals and priorities, and to evaluate its activities in light of its mission and goals.
 - **b.** To seek to involve all members of this congregation in worship, learning, witness, service, and support.
 - **c.** To oversee and provide for the administration of this congregation to enable it to fulfill its functions and perform its mission.
 - **d.** To maintain supportive relationships with the rostered minister(s) and staff and help them annually to evaluate the fulfillment of their calling, appointment, or employment.
